

Testing phase of the Migrantech platform in France



Within the framework of the Migrantech project, a kit of 40 e-modules intended for migrants/refugees and professionals working with this public and allowing the development of the most valued skills on the job market is freely available on the digital platform <u>migrantech.org</u> In order to improve the content of the emodules as well as the design of the platform, the latter was tested within AMSED by 40 migrants and/or refugees, who provided feedback in the form of a questionnaire on the content and form of the modules, as well as on the platform's ease of navigation.

THE ORGANIZATION OF THE TESTING PHASE

The profile of the participants

The platform was tested by 40 participants during 5 sessions organized in Strasbourg, at AMSED headquarters.

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The profiles of the participants were very diverse, being of different ages and nationalities: they came mainly from Iran, Ukraine, Georgia, Syria, Morocco, Algeria, Chechnya, Tunisia, Afghanistan and Vietnam.

This diversity of profiles was also seen in the difference in the life paths of the candidates and in their levels of qualification, some having fled the war, others having lived in France for a long time, and still others having graduated. It was interesting to note that this may have largely influenced their approach to the training program and their requirements for it.







The conduct of the sessions

The five sessions of the testing phase were held in a dedicated room, where each participant had a computer provided by AMSED. Each session included between 10 and 20 participants from the AMSED database.

After welcoming the participants, the AMSED team introduced the project and its main objectives, and explained that they could choose a module to complete on the platform. Questionnaires were then distributed, to which the participants answered according to their impressions on the platform and the content of the e-modules.
